# PROGRAM NOTES: Movies & More



One of the best parts of a movie, at least to some people including musicians, is often the music. From sweeping, epic scores to singable melodies, can you begin to imagine movies without the music that helps make them memorable and magical? Not all of the music on our program is from movies, thus the “and More” in our title today. Below are notes of the pieces not known for being used in film. Among these non-cinematic pieces are the following:



## **A Sorrowful Memory**

This piece performed by members of our trumpet section was arranged for by Valter Valerio. The original song was sung by 1980s-90s Korean singer, Lee Moon Sae (pictured).



## **Entrance of the Gladiators**

Julius Fucik (1872-1916) composed this military march in 1897, and it gained its widest popularity after American publisher Carl Fischer released a version of the march for wind bands in 1901 under the title, “Thunder and Blazes.” It quickly became the now-famous circus screamer march used for introducing clowns in the Big Top! Technically, this piece hasn’t been used in a movie soundtrack, but it has been parodied in movies and TV shows including *Doctor Who*, *The Simpsons*, *South Park*, and *V for Vendetta*.



## **Beddy-Bye** (Duet for Flute & Flugelhorn)

This duet featuring Marsha Hope (flute) and Tom Evans (flugelhorn), both of whom are past band presidents, was written as a lullaby and is the second movement of a three-movement piece for flute and flugelhorn called “A Strange Combination.” In Tom’s words, “Having played in band together for a decade, Marsha and I have always wanted a piece of music we could play together. Flute and trumpet (or flugelhorn) is not a combination composers write for, so I wrote my own piece. As an aside, we are rehearsing the first movement now which has a cello and string bass accompaniment and bongos. Kind of a Latin jazz groove.” According to Evans, the duo was planning to perform all three movements at classical open mic night at BuzzBrews until COVID shut everything down. According to our MCB composer-in-residence Evans, “Someday we will yet.”



## **Royal Processionals**

Arranger Murray Houllif (1948-) arranged this piece for percussion sextet (with optional piccolo), featuring majestic processionals “The British Grenadiers” and Mouret’s “Rondeau.”



## **House of the Rising Sun**

The arrangement of this well-known piece of music featuring members of our Flute Choir is based on a traditional folk song that is sometimes called "Rising Sun Blues." The piece tells the story of a person's life gone wrong when in New Orleans. The version of this song that is probably best known was recorded by The Animals, a British rock band, in 1964. The song has a long and varied history, having been covered by a wide range of singers over the years including folk singers Woody Guthrie in 1941 and Joan Baez in 1960, TV and movie star Andy Griffith in 1959, country music legend Dolly Parton in 1981 on her *9 to 5 and Odd Jobs* album, and even actor Jeremy Renner (best known as Marvel Comic's Hawkeye) in 2019.
